### Background

- Several reasons to investigate the health of people with non-traditional sexual practices and alternative sexual identities (kink or BDSM)
  - Some behaviors may involve higher risk to health
  - Given social stigma, there may be health disparities related to alt-sex identities

# Previous Study The KINK Health Project

 First study 2015: interview study, 115 participants, kink-identified, thematic analysis of interviews.


#### KEY FINDINGS:


- certain types of injuries experienced,
- 44% of the sample had visited a doctor for a kink-related health concern;
- some people hid the origin of concern or injury.
- Anticipated stigma was high;
  - only 38% were out as kinky.



## Our Current Study The KINK Health SURVEY

- US National Survey
- Inclusion criteria: 18 years or older, living in the United States, have had fantasies, desires, longings around kink/fetish, and currently practice a kink or fetish related behavior
- Data collected from April 2016 to October 2016
- PRELIMINARY REPORT today based on 987 completed surveys







## Physical Health

• 14% had a *kink-related injury* or medical complication at some point in their lives

 31% had discussed a kink-related health concern or question with a medical professional

#### Mental Health

- Ever hospitalized for a mental health concern?
  - 15.75% yes
- Currently taking medication for a mental health condition?
  - 35.74% yes
- Have you ever attempted suicide?
  - 24.70% yes

## Very surprising....

 Have you ever intentionally harmed yourself outside of a consensually negotiated kink scene? (e.g. self-cutting, scratching, hair pulling, self-hitting, picking skin or scabs, etc.)

45% YES

We need to know more

#### Impact of Kink on Mental Health

Do you feel that your involvement in kink has affected your mental health, either positively or negatively?

78.10 % said YES

#### Of those:

- 85.16% said Positively,
- 1.1% said Negatively,
- 13.67% said BOTH Positively and Negatively

"My relationship with my current primary involves very cathartic scenes, often with him breaking through the barriers that I put up, and ending with really good, deep emotional release. Afterwards, he will hold me and rock me, making me feel as though I have someone who cares about the way I am, for the first time in my life. I have had trust issues, and an inability to let myself be openly vulnerable, due to an absent mother and an emotionally neglectful father. I have taken care of myself from a very young age (grade school) and have never allowed someone to take care of me until him. Our relationship began as a simple D/s one, but has evolved into a Daddy Dom/girl very naturally. ... no one has ever taken me in hand before, nurturing and guiding."

"Kink helped me heal from the molestation, bullying, anger, depression, and anxiety I felt and experienced. I was broken and in some ways still am, but the kink community and my pagan community have both been instrumental in breaking down those walls and helping me grow. If it were not for the members of my House I would most likely still be lost and searching for an identity....and I don't think that I would be as happy. When I started I needed the pain....now I just need someone who cares enough to help me fulfill myself and drive me towards being my best self. I don't think I could get that in a vanilla relationship.'
